

WorkBC: Find your place

WorkBC Employment Services Centres are here to support you in getting a job and keeping it.

WorkBC Employment Services are available to all unemployed or precariously employed (i.e. workers who have unstable jobs, those who are poorly paid, or those in jobs that do not a match their skills) British Columbians who are seeking employment and are legally eligible to work in BC. The program offers a range of services that support individuals looking for work to find and maintain a job and to improve employment readiness.

Your WorkBC Centre will help you identify what personal supports and services you are eligible to receive and meet your needs.

What WorkBC Employment Services offers:

- personal employment planning
- group or individual workshops
- job search services
- skills enhancement services such as academic upgrading and training
- customized employment and work experience placement services for clients with significant barriers to employment
- self-employment services
- funding supports for expenses such as dependent care, transportation to help you get to job interviews or training, and essential work clothing (e.g. steel toe boots), tools, supplies or equipment.
